Australian Wakes Up Speaking Chinese

Two years ago 22 year-old Ben McMahon woke from a coma. He had been lying unconscious in hospital for over a week, following a car crash, which almost claimed his life. Doctors at the hospital in Melbourne, where Ben was taken following the accident, told his parents it would be a "miracle if he survived." Thankfully, he did but he woke up a different person. The young Australian remembers waking and seeing a nurse who looked Asian standing by his bed. He said, 'Excuse me nurse, I feel really sore here.' What was so unusual, however, was that he said it in fluent Mandarin. He then asked the nurse for some paper and pen and scrawled on it in Mandarin: 'I love my mum and dad, I will recover.' He now says, 'Most of it's hazy, but when I woke up I thought I was in China. It was surreal. I just started speaking Chinese.'

Growing up, Ben studied Chinese, and even visited Beijing, but could never speak the language fluently until after the coma. It appears that Ben was suffering from what is known as Foreign Language Syndrome, which occurs after a serious trauma to the

brain. This is extremely rare, with only five cases reported in the past decade, four of them in the past five years. After a period of unconsciousness, the patient speaks in a language they weren't able to speak prior to the incident, often forgetting their mother tongue. This is temporary for most, although some speak the language for an extended period of time. In Ben's case it took him several days to start to regain his English-speaking abilities, and several months to perfect them, but the Mandarin was there to stay.

Ben decided to use his new language skills to his advantage. He conducted tours of Melbourne for Chinese tourists, and hosted a Mandarin TV show called 'Au My Ga,' which helped Chinese expats better understand Australian culture. Now fully recovered, Ben lives in Shanghai, hosting TV shows and studying commerce at university. His Mandarin-speaking friends say he is the best non-native speaker they have ever heard.
